

What are "Core Classes"?

- Core classes at Irving Middle School are classes that all students take every year.
- Core Classes:
 - Math
 - English
 - Social Studies: History (7th)/Civics (8th)
 - Science
- PE/Health- All students take each year

Types of <u>Core Classes</u> Offered at WIMS



- General Education class with <u>no</u> Special Education Support:
 - For all levels
 - Reflects the grade level standards and curriculum
 - One General Education teacher supports this class
 - Class size capacity is around 30 students
- Team-Taught General Education class:
 - Reflects the grade level standards and curriculum
 - Class size capacity is around 30 students
 - Two teachers support this class one General Education teacher and one Special Education teacher
 - Students with and without IEPs access this class

Types of <u>Core Classes</u> Offered at WIMS



Small Group:

- One special education teacher, sometimes additional IA support
- Class size is reduced to 10-12 students per class
- Only students with IEPs access this class
- Core content that reflects the 7th grade standards and curriculum

Advanced Academics class with Special Education support:

- For honors or AAP level courses
- Reflects the appropriate grade level standards and curriculum
- One teacher supports this class with support of an Instructional Assistant
- Class size capacity is around 30 students

Small Group Adapted Curriculum



- Core content reflects the Virginia Essential Standards of Learning
- Students accessing the modified assessment: Virginia Alternate Assessment Program (VAAP)
- Only students with an IEP utilizing modified & adapted content can access small group adapted curriculum classes
- Students in the adapted curriculum small group classes may access the following support classes:
 - Work and Transition (WAT)
 - Life Skills
 - Adapted Physical Education

Choosing Between Gen Ed & Honors

- <u>Gen Ed Courses</u> prepare students to meet grade level standards, be successful in high school and fulfill graduation requirements.
- Honors/AAP Courses: At Irving MS, we are committed to providing the same complex, high-level thinking and skills in all course levels. Honors classes are designed to provide students with the opportunity to go deeper into a content area where they have interest and passion. Please be aware that Honors courses require students to complete work independently and in a shorter timeframe than in other courses



*AAP vs Honors & Our 2E Students

Any student can take an honors class however, students <u>must qualify</u> for Level 4 services in order to take AAP courses.



For optimal learning our 2e students have access to an AART in addition to their IEP case manager to meet their dual programming needs





Strategies for Success	Personal Development	Special Education Literacy Elective
 Supports organization, study skills, executive functioning, self-advocacy, and time management Students work in small group setting with special education teacher 	 Supports emotional and social skills development including coping skills, problem solving, executive function, communication skills Students have social/emotional and/or behavior goals 	 Supports decoding, and/or reading fluency skills for students typically 3 or more years below grade level Utilizes an evidence based instructional approach Students are programmed matched

More Independance & Responsibility

- Block Scheduling approximately 85 minute periods
- Students manage 8 different classes and develop work/study skills
- After School Programming and Academic Support M/Tu/Th
- Students are expected to show R.O.C.K in the hallways, cafeteria and classrooms.
