Adapted Curriculum Programming


- Students accessing Enhanced Autism Services, Intellectual Disability Service, and Services
- Full Time Special Education Teacher and 2 full time instructional assistants
- PCM Trained Staff
- Class Sizes 5-10 students
- ABA/BIT Support
- FBA/BIPs
- Adapted Curriculum
- Some General Education Curriculum
- Most students take VAAP some take SOL

- Students receive all core instruction with their special education teacher within their special education classroom
- Students transition to PE (Special Education Setting) with Adapted PE teacher and Instructional Assistants
- Students transition to WAT (Work Awareness and Transition) class with Instructional Assistants
- Some students eat in cafeteria some in classroom depending on needs
- Related Services provide support in the classroom with some pull out

What are "Core Classes"?

- Core classes at Irving Middle School are classes that all students take every year.
- Core Classes:
 - o Math
 - English
 - Social Studies: History (7th)/Civics (8th)
 - Science
- PE/Health- All students take each year



Honors/AAP Classes

Rigorous, fast paced curriculum and instruction

Increased focus on **depth** and **complexity** in specific subjects

Open Enrollment: Students enroll based on their **strengths**, **interests** and **potential**

Focuses on developing **self-advocacy skills** (organizing Schoology courses, asking questions, attending tutoring, etc)

Focuses on developing student **independence** and **responsibility**

Choosing Between Gen Ed & Honors

- <u>Gen Ed Courses</u> prepare students to meet grade level standards, be successful in high school and fulfill graduation requirements.
- Honors/AAP Courses: At Irving MS, we are committed to providing the same complex, high-level thinking and skills in all course levels. Honors classes are designed to provide students with the opportunity to go deeper into a content area where they have interest and passion. Please be aware that Honors courses require students to complete work independently and in a shorter timeframe than in other courses



*AAP vs Honors & Our 2E Students

Any student can take an honors class however, students <u>must qualify</u> for Level 4 services in order to take AAP courses.



For optimal learning our 2e students have access to an AART (part time) in addition to their IEP case manager to meet their dual programming needs

Core Class Choices

For most subjects, you will be able to choose between the gen ed and Honors version of the class.

- Science 7 (Gen Ed, TT, SG, or Blended)
 Science 7 Honors or AAP
- Math 7 (Gen Ed, TT, SG, or Blended)
 Math 7 Honors or Algebra Honors
- History 7 (Gen Ed, TT, SG, or Blended)
 History 7 Honors or AAP
- English 7 Gen Ed, TT, SG, or Blended)
 English 7 Honors or AAP



3rd Period ROCK Block (Advisory)/Learning Seminar

- All students at Irving are assigned to a grade level Advisory class, which will remain the same throughout the year!
- This is a class period that focuses on socioemotional learning and developing important skills that help our students be successful.
- Students can expect to learn the in's and out's of Irving Middle school within the first few weeks of school!



3rd Period ROCK Block (Advisory)/Learning Seminar

Learning Seminar is part of the period 3 ROCK Block class. During the last 45-minutes of class, students do the following:

- Meet with teachers for academic support
- Receive additional support from their math, english or literacy teacher. (Acceleration)
- Have the opportunity to choose from a variety of enrichment activities that are geared towards students likes/interests. Ex: board games, cooking, aquaponics, and many more!
